What T4T-ALI does

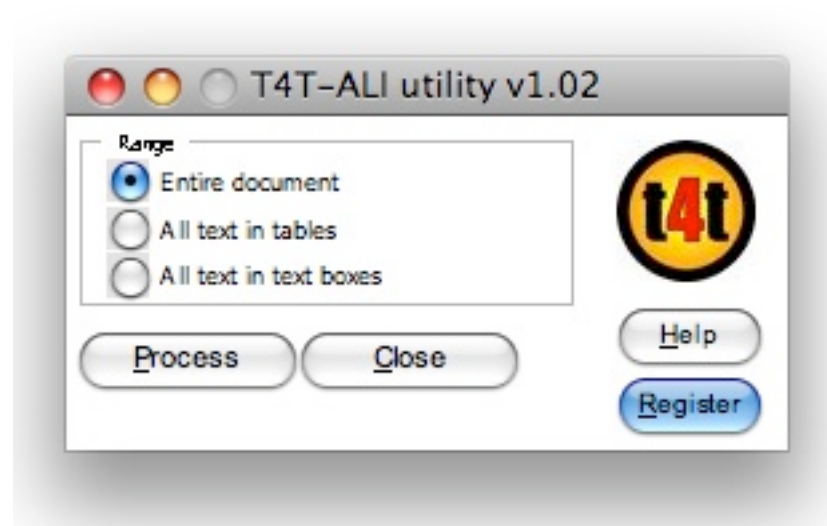
Quite simply, T4T-ALI is an alignment utility that splits a Microsoft Word document into logical sentences and exports them to a new Word document. The output is a two-column table and the sentences are in the left-hand column. The right-hand column is empty. This is where you add your translations. You can then use your completed table as a glossary with T4T-S&R or T4T-SRT.

Installing T4T-ALI

Because it is the same for all T4T utilities, the installation process is explained in the separate document "Installer_ReadMeFIRST". This allows us to keep our utility ReadMes short and to the point.

Running T4T-ALI

This assumes that you have installed T4T-ALI and can see the yellow toolbar button containing the letters “ALI”.



This is the ALI Controls window.

And this is the toolbar button:



1. The fastest way to get acquainted with T4T-ALI is to work with the enclosed demo file: “T4T-ALI-input.doc”.
2. Launch Word and open “T4T-ALI-input.doc”.
3. Then launch T4T-ALI by clicking on the yellow ALI toolbar button.
4. Select “Entire document” and click on the “Process” button.
5. The result will be the table shown in “T4T-ALI-output.doc”.
6. In the demo mode, T4T-ALI replaces every third sentence with the note “Demo mode”.
